



ABOUT THE NEST

The “**NEST**” is the official publication of the Nueva Ecija University of Science and Technology provided by the National Library with an International Standard Serial Number of 2672-3743. This was established and approved in April 2018. The NEST aims to disseminate information regarding the fundamental undertakings of the faculty, administration, and staff for one whole year.

SYMBOLS AND MEANINGS:

The NEST stands for “**Nurturing Ethical, Socially Responsible, and Task-driven Professionals**”. Its logo is akin to a nest (the White Head) composed of people who are working together, nurtured and safeguarded by a reputable leader (The **Hand holding the Head**). Inside the **HEAD** are the **TORCH** that represents the Quality Services provided by the University, academically and non-academically, to its clientele; the **BULB** that symbolizes the **ENLIGHTENMENT** of the **MIND** and **HEARTS** of the students through the **WILL POWER** of every Faculty to help them be excellent in their chosen fields. Inside the bulb are: the **GEAR** that epitomizes the “Education” and the Mobility of Development, Growth, and Progress; the **ATOM** that symbolizes the NEUST being a Science and Technology institution; the **HEAD** symbolizes the NEST where the NEUST workforce resides with the leadership of a President; the **TWO HANDS WITH TWO DIFFERENT COLORS** holding the head that represent the stability of the President in handling the whole University and the people working together with one goal, and the two colors of the hands stand for the NEUST employees’ **DIVERSITY** of views and opinions, expertise, attributes, uniqueness, situations, and contentment. With these, the President shows mobility and flexibility in handling these diversities with stability, tenacity, and decisiveness.

As to its color representation, white symbolizes the fundamental and noble vision, mission, and core values of NEUST, being a government institution that aims to serve the whole community and its stakeholders; Light Blue epitomizes the virtues that the Nueva University of Science and Technology has been inculcating to its employees- upholding loyalty to the institution, honesty, and transparency to the people served and dealt with, commitment, dedication, and trustworthiness as NEUST employees; Gold represents the characteristics of what a government employee should have possessed for the welfare and interest of the people served; and green which signifies the healing power that can help enhance stability and endurance like the University President who shows great stability and commitment to put the University on the right track.

Professionalism and Work Ethics



To be professional, a person must be ethical in mind, in words, and in deeds, especially in the workplace. Professionalism shows the person's "Ethics"; a reflection of his/her attitude in the place of work; a demonstration of his behavior towards his/her job and the company where he/she belongs.

According to Eric Mochnacz, HR consultant at Red Clover, "Professionalism is someone's inherent ability to do what is expected of him/her and to deliver quality work because he/she is driven to do so." This means that any task entrusted to a person, he/she must exhibit utmost integrity and high level of performance.

Professionalism is also a reflection of the person's actions towards his/her colleagues or with others, his/her mode of dressing, and the manner of treating people. This is proven by Sarah Walker, HR manager at Miracle Mile Law Group when she said that "Professionalism includes speaking with your colleagues in a respectful manner, conducting yourself with integrity, and being courteous".

According to a LinkedIn post from Leandro Valente, MBA, there are "10 Golden Rules to Professional Ethics in the Workplace":

1. **Strive for Excellence.** To achieve excellence, a person must exert effort in making all his/her undertakings astounding and well-defined. This is the first rule to achieving greatness in whatever endeavor you undertake; this is the quality that makes you and your work stand out.
2. **Be Trustworthy.** In a workplace, trust is a big deal. A worker who exhibits trustworthiness possesses the characteristics of an righteous professional.
3. **Be Accountable.** To be accountable means to be aware of all the actions taken on in the workplace and to have the courage to stand for your actions and for the repercussions of those actions, either good or bad.
4. **Be Courteous and Humble.** To be courteous is to be humble and polite with others. As a professional with ethics, a person needs to display an attitude of being well-mannered as a gesticulation of selfless acts toward others like colleagues, friends, neighbors, and families.
5. **Be Honest and Transparent.** Honesty is linked to a person's positive standpoints as turning down to lie and to deceive people. To be honest is to be truthful, fair, open in communication, sincere, straightforward in character, and engaged at work with or without someone to look at to.
6. **Be Competent.** It is the person's ability to do a job well or with high level of performance. This is also the adeptness of a person to accomplish the assigned tasks with integrity and high-spiritedness.
7. **Be Ethical.** Ethical behavior is acting within certain moral codes in accordance with the generally accepted code of conduct or rules.
8. **Be Honorable and Decent.** Honorable action is behaving in a way that portrays "nobility of soul, magnanimity and a scorn of meanness" which is derived from virtuous conduct and personal integrity.
9. **Be respectful of confidential.** This is respecting the set of rules, promises, or agreements that restrict a person from further and unauthorized dissemination of information.
10. **Set a Good Example.** Setting good examples means doing things that are morally upright; offering people trust; letting people you believe in them; and showing them positive demeanor and performance.

To follow the above rules on professional ethics is on edge because no one has been created as flawless. As humans, people commit mistakes and that is understandable and forgivable. Even so, we must try to value what God has given to us- the mind and heart that will tell us what to do, what to avoid, and what is best, not only for ourselves but for others, especially for our family and for the people who have been part of our lives, such as our co-workers, the people around us, and those who need our comradeship and services.

Professionalism and ethics are indeed what an organization calls for in order to achieve advancement and success. To realize these, we, in the organization, need to cultivate the essence of teamwork, unity, steadfastness, engagement, and focus. (ARM)

NEUST takes part in the Nationwide Simultaneous Earthquake Drill

The University joined the government in promoting a culture of awareness for the so-called "The Big One" as they participated in the nationwide simultaneous earthquake drill on **August 08, 2019** at exactly 2:00 in the afternoon with the participation of the administrators headed by the University President, **Dr. Felician P. Jacoba**, **Dr. Jugo** (VPAA), **Dr. Panahon** (VPBAF), **Dr. Moralde** (VPRET), and the Deans and Directors from different colleges and campuses.

The Planning and Development Office headed by Dr. Sarah C. Alvarez, through the University Risk Reduction Management Unit (UDRRMU), supervised by Mr. Jeff Amaranto led the drill which sought to strengthen the University's preparedness for a powerful earthquake predicted to hit the country when the West Valley Fault moves. Further, it also aimed to equip the students, faculty, and staff of the university with the knowledge of the safety

measures and proper attitude needed before, during, and after earthquakes.

Prior to the drill, students were already oriented about the do's and don'ts in times of calamities/disasters. In addition, they were also familiarized with the safe places where they should go in case a calamity hits the school. The said places are based on the Evacuation Plan designed by the UDRRMU.

The drill started with the siren, the long wailing sound to signal calamities. Upon hearing it, the teachers made sure that the students strictly followed the safety precautions as instructed to them and as practiced during the previous drills such as ducking, covering or holding their head, watching out for falling objects, and keeping calm while going out of their classrooms. They went straight to the designated areas, walking briskly but observing their line so as to

avoid stampede or any form of commotion that might cause them harm.

When everyone reached the designated areas, the teachers and the leaders of each class did a headcount to ensure that everyone was safe and complete. In case of missing students a

search and rescue might be executed.

By and large, the drill was carried out smoothly. All safety measures were followed for the security of everyone, most especially of the students. However, the need to spread awareness and preparedness for the disasters must be continued

and should always be treated seriously and with great importance. Moreover, the UDRRMU must continue to plan and conduct activities to intensify the readiness and responsiveness of all the members of the University community in case an earthquake occurs in an unexpected time.

The **4-day training** was held at **NEUST Nieto Hall, Sumacab Campus**. Leading the training were **Mrs. Jean D. Pascual** and **Mr. Rey Lovell B. Sabado**, Red Cross Instructors. On the first day of the Red Cross training, first aid and basic life support were discussed and demonstrated to the participants. In return, participants were tasked to perform Cardio Pulmonary Resuscitation (CPR). On the second day, a brief lecture was made regarding the general Automatic External Defibrillator (AED) precautions and special


AED situations, the things that a person with pacemaker must do. After watching the video presentation and the actual demonstration of the instructors, participants were asked to do actual performances. Then graded simulation on the use of AED followed. On the third day, First Aid Management for wounds, bone injuries, and burns were explained to the participants, followed by bandaging techniques in pairs.

As a culminating activity, a group practical exam was

designed and conducted by the instructors where the participants were given an opportunity to demonstrate decision-making and apply their knowledge and skills in an emergency scenario conducted at the conclusion of the course. Wrapping up the last day of the training was an evaluation of the simulation activity where the participants and the trainers shared their insights and experiences on the activities organized and carried out.

It was initiated by the Wetlands International, in cooperation with the Zoological Society of London (ZSL) held last September 26, 29, 2019. The University CER was represented by Mr. Jan Ramel A. Tumbaga (CER Head) and Mr. Renzo Carlo S. Impelido (CER Unit Head for Training). The study tour was also participated in by the other academicians coming from BuISU and several LGUs in Nueva Ecija, from the Municipality of Obando and Sasmuan, City of Malolos, PENRO Pampanga, Bataan PGENRO, Balanga Provincial Tourism Office, and BFAR for Central Luzon Regional Office. The said event focused on integrating both the gray-green infrastructures as a means of reducing disaster risks and a means of restoring the ecosystem, or in general, “Building with Nature”.

During the exposure trip, the participants were brought in places where building with nature was best practiced in Ilo-Ilo. Pedada, Ajuy Breakwater was the first to be introduced to the participants. The Ajuy Breakwater is an example of combined gray-green infrastructure because it is used to reduce the rate of soil erosion while and at the same time, to permit the accretion of sediments. On the other hand, the mangroves planted behind the breakwater enhance the soil accretion rate and act as natural protection buffers for wave surges and tsunamis.

The second place was the Katunggan Ecopark which was once an abandoned, underutilized, and unproductive fishpond, but now turned into a mangrove nursery and propagation site that helps in the conservation of several mangrove species which has been managed by the local community. During the study tour, the participants were taught how to

properly select, bag, and plant mangrove seedlings or wildlings from the nursery area to the actual planting site in coastal areas. Furthermore, the participants were introduced to the T-fence technology used up the by coastal communities to reduce the rate of coastal erosion and wave actions and even consumed as aid in the restoration of sediments.

The concept of integrating gray-green infrastructures in the design of a project is an innovative measure to increase the community resiliency. This way, both the project proponents and stakeholders will be benefited from its subsequent effects like the mitigation of erosion and sediment restoration, the protection and buffer from strong wind and wave actions, the restoration and promotion of local biodiversity, and the provision of potential livelihood opportunities such as in the case of Ajuy Breakwater and Katunggan Ecopark.

Based on the research conducted by the Department of Agriculture during the Innovation Olympics 2018 and published in Philippine Star on June 2018, the average age of Filipino farmers in the Philippines belongs to age ranging from 57-59 years old. The data prove that young generation of Filipinos are reluctant in pursuing a career in farming.

With this current situation, a research-based extension project entitled **"Tubong Pinoy: A Techno-Agri Project"** had been proposed by the MSIT Graduate School with **Mr. Allen Paul L Esteban**, a newly-hired faculty of the Graduate School and College of Information and Communications Technology. The project was approved on

August 15, 2019 between the municipality of Bongabon and NEUST. The project aimed to assist the local farmers and to teach the younger generations in farming with the use of the modern and advanced technology. It is a web-based application with mobile responsive platform called **"Tubong Pinoy: An Online Portal with Decision Support for Crop Production"**. The decision support and predictive capabilities of the Tubong Pinoy (TP) will increase the awareness and agricultural productivity of the municipality of Bongabon because of its features.

Under this project, it is planned to make a centralized system where new generation of farmers, suppliers, traders, and

agricultural experts can make their individual account to meet in one portal and help each other to create sustainable agriculture. They are called "Collaborators". There's also a unified marketplace where farmers can buy farming supplies such as fertilizers, pesticides, seeds, and others, monitored by the Department of Agriculture with a regulated price. It helps the market remove the additional fees in agricultural products added by a middle man. The trading system platform will help the farmers to sell their harvested crops in the market with wide range of traders and competitive price.


1. downloadable forms for extension services;

Selected faculty members of NEUST participated in the scientific writing for international publication dubbed as: Training on **Scientific Writing for Qualitative and Quantitative Studies: ISI and Scopus Standards** organized by the **International Association of Scholarly Publishers, Editors and Reviewers (IASPER)** on **November 11 – 14, 2019** at **Selah Pods Hotel, Pasay City, Metro Manila**.

The objectives of said training were to enhance the participants' quality of scientific writing for acceptability in international publications; to eliminate the communication errors that the researchers make when publishing a scientific paper; and to determine the standards of ISI and Scopus publications in indexing journals as a basis for advanced writing

skills to meet their expectations. To come up with the set objectives, the following topics were discussed:

Lecture 1: Parts of a scientific paper (PART A: The Elsevier Scopus Standard);

Lecture 2: Common errors and pitfalls in writing a scientific paper;

Lecture 3: Anatomy of publishable paper;

Lecture 4: Parts of a scientific paper (Part B: The IASPER Style Sheet);

Lecture 5: Examining a scientific paper through the peer reviewers view point;

Lecture 6: Subsuming statistical analyses in results and discussion section for accurate, crisp, fluid, and

elegant article for international publication;

Lecture 7: The pathologies in introduction of scientific papers: how to diagnose and remedy them; and

Lecture 8: Technology based quality assurance for publishable research articles.


