EDITORIAL TRANSPARENCY

Pursuant to Executive Order No. 2, s. 2016, the Filipino people have the right to information and full public disclosure and transparency in the public service. This entails that all public agencies are expected to provide services with openness and sincerity. They must do things according to the welfare or interest of the people. Public service means public trust. This also means being trustworthy and outspoken to the people who are recipients of government amenities.

As a government agency, it is truly essential to show that serving the people must be a concoction of transparency and accountability. This indicates that to be truly a public servant, one must have the willingness and desire to provide services without putting things out of sight; the commitment in providing essential services for the interest of the people served; the pleasure in dealing with the people who need help and assistance; must have the altruism in the delivery of actions without waiting for something in return; the conscientiousness to provide services endowed to the clients; and the compassion and consideration regarding the services offered.

In the Philippines, the elected President gives his/her annual report called the State of the Nation Address once a year, and that action is obviously an example of transparency, in which all the accomplishments for the whole year will be reported to the general public.

NEUST is one of the government institutions that provides services according to the needs of its clientele. One of the core values that the University has been laying emphasis on is TRANSPARENCY, a single word but with vast meaning that can make the people contended or dejected. This is unequivocally true. As great evidence, two best practices of NEUST, through its appointed head or president, which is done year on year, are the "ULAT NG PANGULO and "A TIME WITH THE PRESIDENT". he University conducted an Institutional Training Workshop for Indigenous People's (IP) Educators in Compliance with the CHED Memorandum Order No. 02 series of 2019 on May 27-28, 2019 which was held at the COE Seminar Room. It was a partnership activity between the National Commission for Indigenous Peoples headed by its Provincial Officer, Dr. Donato B. Bumacas, and NEUST Center for Indigenous Peoples Education (CIPE) with Dr. Arneil Gabriel as the head. The said undertaking dealt with matters about the integration of Indigenous People's (IP) Studies/Education into relevant Higher Education Curricula. This means that all public and private higher education institutions (HEIs) are enjoined to offer IP Education in their respective curricula by integrating or incorporating it into the higher education subjects such as history, social sciences, political science, sociology, and humanities and by including readings about Indigenous People and Muslims in the New General Education Curriculum, in particular, Philippine History.

In conclusion, the presented curriculum and revised syllabi were reviewed and critiqued by the Deans of the different colleges.

n response to a more extensive learning of the growing generation of the NEUST Engineering students, the initiative of providing additional laboratory equipment was included among the university's priorities in support to the vision of the science and technology program.

Last June 10, 11, and 21, 2019, a training was provided by the NEUST College of Engineering in collaboration with the State Alliance Enterprises, Inc., along with the CE faculty members which was held at the CE Laboratory, Sumacab Campus. The goal of the training was to improve the utilization of the new laboratory equipment which is fundamentally used for monitoring the behavior of the structure, stress, strain, and deformation of materials (UTM) and visualization of fluid flows considering the different types of weirs and other obstructions that may affect the fluid flows transition. The training included both the theoretical and hands-on components.

Critical procedures on preventive maintenance, validation, and qualifications of the equipment were also covered, including the specific tasks such as lubrication, cleaning, and replacing of parts.

The staff and faculty concretize the important roles in developing the University's vision. Integration of laboratory experience with active forms of learning can help the students to be at their best.

he National Flag Day in the Philippines is celebrated on the 28th day of May. This activity sets sights on the commemoration of the time when the Philippine flag was first hoisted as a sign that the Filipino people got hold of their independence against the Spanish colonialism that was held in Imus, Cavite.

The Philippine flag has its symbolistic colors and figures that show what the Philippines has as a country with freedom and sovereignty. The Blue color symbolizes the "willingness" of every Filipino to sacrifice for freedom; the Red color signifies the Filipinos' courage and patriotism; the White color represents liberty, equality, and fraternity among the Filipino people. The eight-rayed sun symbolizes the first eight provinces, namely: Manila, Cavite, Batangas, Bulacan, Laguna, Pampanga, Tarlac, and Nueva Ecija. The three fivepointed stars represent the three main island groups, namely: Luzon, Visayas, and Mindanao.

the following: Fire Triangle, Elements of Fire, Classification of Fire, Fire Extinguishment Theory, Proper Use of Fire Extinguisher, and Tips on What to do in Case of Fire. FO1 Galano emphasized the importance of remembering the acronym SAFETY:

S – Sound the alarm

- **A** Advise fire brigade
- **F** Fight fire, if possible
- **E** Evacuate the area/premises
- T Tell others
- **Y** You get out, clear the area"

As a culminating activity, four (4) volunteers from the seminar participants were asked to demonstrate how to use the fire extinguisher properly. One of them was the University President who volunteered to use the fire extinguisher- how to open it properly, what to press when opening, and how to cease the fire using it. After which, the guest lecturer emphasized the proper technique in using the fire extinguisher by remembering the acronym PASS.

P – Pull the pin. (It is there to prevent accidental discharge.)

A – Aim low at the base of the fire. (This is where the fuel source is.)

S – Squeeze the lever above the handle. Release to stop the flow.

S – Sweep from side to side.





he College of Arts and Sciences headed by its dean, Dr. Mario M. Abasamis, Jr., through its Research and Training Services Units spearheaded by Mr. Mickel Angelo Rivera and Dr. Arceli R. Millan respectively, conducted a three-day Research Writeshop and In-house Review last April 3-5, 2019. The activity aimed to provide the faculty researchers an explicit guidance on the writing of a research article, from the organization of the abstract to the conclusion. The theoretical knowledge for the workshop was drawn from decades of research on the rhetorical structure and conventions of research articles in various disciplines.

The training began with the presentation of the structure of a research article in terms of the moves and steps on the different sections of a particular research article which involved writing of abstract, introduction, method, results, discussions, and conclusions. This can be achieved through high quality researches.

Its general goal is to conduct a relevant and globally competitive research, and thus promote and effectively address environmental awareness which will lead the NEUST research agenda on environmental concerns and forging linkages with government institutions for collaborations and funding.

The center's research agenda

focus on the different environmental fields such as Biodiversity Conservation and Capital Accounting, and Valuation of Ecosystem Services, Pollution Prevention and Control, Climate Change, Disaster Risk Reduction and Management, Environmental Hazards and Human Health, Green Energy Technology, and Governance. The recent feats of the center consist of the First NEUST Environmental Forum, Basic Remote Sensing using QGIS 3.4.4., Panel Discussion for Wetlands, which gained the attention of Wetlands International, and the establishment of the Environmental Research Journal that is in the pipeline of the development.
