On November 25, 2020, the Freedom of Information held its 1st virtual FOI Awarding ceremony. Out of the hundred SUCs nominated in the 2020 FOI awards, there were only three universities that were acknowledged and given special recognition: the University of the Philippines, the Polytechnic University of the Philippines, and the Nueva Ecija University of Science and Technology headed by its president, Dr. Feliciana P. Jacoba. These three universities were awarded as FOI Champions.

The basis in the selection was the excellent performance in the implementation of the Freedom of Information, being part of the University's daily operation in terms of the clientele's request



for information; consistency of early compliance relative to the PBB requirements; early submission of the other requirements asked by the FOI management office; and constant coordination with the FOI Management Office for some queries and update on FOI matters.

The people behind the success of the NEUST FOI are Dr. Sarah Alvarez (Planning and Development Office Director); Dr. Arceli Millan (University Publication and Media Affairs Office Head and FOI Focal Person/Receiving Officer); and Engr. The audit aimed at determining if the University's management system works in its day-to-day operations. It involved planning of the operations; trainings, research, and extension (Continue to Page 4)



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


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ABOUT THE NEST

The "NEST" is the official publication of the Nueva Ecija University of Science and Technology provided by the National Library with an International Standard Serial Number of 2672-3743. This was established and approved in April 2018. The NEST aims to disseminate information regarding the fundamental undertakings of the faculty, administration, and staff for one whole year.

SYMBOLS AND MEANINGS:

The NEST stands for "Nurturing Ethical, Socially Responsible, and Taskdriven Professionals". Its logo is akin to a nest (the White Head) composed of people who are working together, nurtured and safeguarded by a reputable leader (The Hand holding the Head). Inside the HEAD are the TORCH that represents the Quality Services provided by the University, academically and non-academically, to its clientele; the BULB that symbolizes the ENLIGHTENMENT of the MIND and HEARTS of the students through the WILL POWER of every Faculty to help them be excellent in their chosen fields. Inside the bulb are: the GEAR that epitomizes the "Education" and the Mobility of Development, Growth, and Progress: the ATOM that symbolizes the NEUST being a Science and Technology institution; the **HEAD** symbolizes the NEST where the NEUST workforce resides with the leadership of a President; the TWO HANDS WITH TWO DIFFERENT COLORS holding the head that represent the stability of the President in handling the whole University and the people working together with one goal, and the two colors of the hands stand for the NEUST employees' DIVERSITY of views and opinions, expertise, attributes, uniqueness, situations, and contentment. With these, the President shows mobility and flexibility in handling these diversities with stability, tenacity, and decisiveness.

As to its color representation, white symbolizes the fundamental and noble vision, mission, and core values of NEUST, being a government institution that aims to serve the whole community and its stakeholders; Light Blue epitomizes the virtues that the Nueva University of Science and Technology has been inculcating to its employees-upholding loyalty to the institution, honesty, and transparency to the people served and dealt with, commitment, dedication, and trustworthiness as NEUST employees; Gold represents the characteristics of what a government employee should have possessed for the welfare and interest of the people served; and green which signifies the healing power that can help enhance stability and endurance like the University President who shows great stability and commitment to put the University on the right track.

Safeguarding the Health and Safety of the Teaching and Non-teaching Personnel in the Face of the Global Covid-19 Pandemic

According to World Organization (2019), a coronavirus (COVID-19) is an infectious disease by a newly discovered coronavirus known as the severe acute respiratory syndrome coronavirus 2 (SARS-CoV-2). The first human cases of COVID-19 were identified in Wuhan City, China in December 2019 (WHO, 2020). As soon as the person gets infected with corona virus, when he/she coughs, there is an exoneration of contaminated fluid or droplets. Close contact with an infected person can be a means to possibly breath in the droplets released through coughing. Other way on how a person can be badly affected by the virus is thru touching contaminated objects like ballpen, tables, cellphones, and others.

With the emergence of this global Covid-10 pandemic, people all over the world felt a sudden strong fear and nervousness, depression, and even anxiety. In consequence, nobody wanted to go outside his/her house; some business establishments ceased to operate; some of the youth got depressed; and many workers lost their jobs. However, despite the pandemic, life must go on regardless of the current situation. People need to work to earn money needed to sustain the basic needs in life.

Earning a living is very vital to survive. One of the very fundamental aspects of life is education. With this, educators need to continuously risk their lives to provide instruction to students. But how can they be protected in the workplace while doing their responsibilities as educators? How can they be safe while teaching the students? How can their health be guarded without being afflicted by the tedious corona

virus? All these issues must be addressed to ensure the health and safety of the educators from the threat of virus.

In response to this, different schools and universities have been trying their best to protect the health and safety of the teaching and non-teaching personnel for they need to continuously report to school in spite of the undesirable situation. They need to risk their lives for the students to still be given quality education. These are done based on the guidelines released by the Inter-Agency Task Force.

Classes are executed through online platforms to avoid face-to-face contact. When the covid-19 proliferated around the world, classes were held using the online platforms such as zoom application, google meet, Schoology, FB page, and others.

Teaching and non-teaching personnel are given the option of working from home scheme. According to Republic Act No. 11165, the telecommuting employees must be provided with an option of working outside of the company or institution where they are working. Though they are outside the office, they are also given the same benefits as employees working in the office.

Safety protocols are observed in the workplace. Follow protocols in the workplace like putting up faucets in the school premises; providing disinfecting supplies such as alcohol, hand sanitizer, and others; lessening interactions with clients (transact through windows only); non-essential travels are discouraged; and providing webinars to be familiar with the do's and don't's in the workplace to avoid the virus.

Physical distancing is followed appropriately. Maintaining a distance of at least 6 feet from other people; posting of signages for the clients to be reminded of the required distance from others; and installing of floor markers for the clients to have guide to follow while entering an establishment or while waiting for their turn to be accommodated, become of the essence.

Students are not allowed to go to school for their safety. Face-to-face classes are not permitted for the students' and teachers' health and safety. If modules are to be provided to students, the parents are the only persons allowed to get in touch with the teachers.

At the Nueva Ecija University of Science and Technology, administration led by the University President, Dr. Feliciana P. Jacoba, ensures that all the employees are safe and healthy by way of providing the 5 ways mentioned above. The University has been implementing the safety protocols according to the Department of Health and Industry. The administration strictly follows what the IATF is putting into action to make sure that the teaching and no-teaching personnel are safe and sound, especially in the workplace.

The pandemic is already existing in the world, and we cannot do something about it. What we can do to avoid the threat of the virus is just to follow the set of rules and guidelines on how to be unscathed in the place where we go, especially in the workplace. Doing these things means being free from danger and being secured from the perilous nature of the covid-19 pandemic. (ARM)



The New Façade of the Fort Magsaysay Campus@52

The Fort Magsaysay Campus is considered a pioneering campus of the then Central Luzon Polytechnic College that started in the late 60s as AFPNOMS (Armed Forces of the Philippines Non Military School) situated in 5-hectares of a dusty (now Barangay Militar). Among its first administrators were the officials of the 1ST Infantry (TABAK) Division of the Fort Ramon Magsaysay. The first teachers were the qualified educators and majority of them were wives of the officials and soldiers.

In the mid of the 70s, the Armed Forces of the Philippines 1ST Infantry Division (TABAK) decided to affiliate with the Central Luzon Polytechnic College (CLPC). Then, on June 10, 1978, the Fort Magsaysay

Campus had its first director, the late Dr. Maximo Macaso. From 431 students in 1978, the Fort Magsaysay Campus became the catch basin of students from the eastern and southeastern part of the province including the Aurora.

The Fort Magsaysay Campus turned 50 in 2018. Its alumni, students, faculty, and staff marked the milestone with lots of fanfare befitting a beloved icon. However, notwithstanding the festive mood of anniversary. golden celebration was overshadowed by the school's manifold problems. One of the problems faced by the campus was the ill conditions of its facilities and physical infrastructure due to old age and due to damages caused by unavoidable the calamities.

From 2018 to 2020, under the esteemed leadership of the University Presidents, Dr. Feliciana P. Jacoba and directorship of Dr. Angelita N. Masa, a total renovation has been made such as re-fencing of the whole campus, establishing of new multi-purpose gym, administration building, campus parking area, and school pathways including the Marcos Hall.

When the COVID-19 global pandemic crisis ambushed the entire world in March, the renovation was interrupted for two months. It was resumed in May 2020. The renovations were totally completed in September 2020.

Presently, the Fort Magsaysay Campus is a very nice place to stay with because of its new and modern facilities and equipment.



BAUERTEK-DOST(III) Seals Partnership with NEUST

With the consensual end-goal producina research-based technology to help and extend services for the betterment of the community, the **NEUST** and BAURTEK Corporation and DOST-Region III sealed their partnership on the 9th of October, 2020. As they convened **NEUST-Sumacab** at Campus, THE University President, Dr. Feliciana P. Jacoba, together with Dr. Rigel Gomez as the CEO and owner of Baurtek Corporation, and Dr. Jaycee Sicat, the Director of DOST-Region III, signed the Memorandum of Agreement for the project, Research, and Development for Production and Processing of Herbal Supplements.

The said project was amiably conceptualized and proposed to establish a proto-type demo farm for the production of moringa (malungay) and other herbal plants at the NEUST-Gabaldon Campus. Given its favorable location and climate, suitable to grow the said herbs, it has the potential to secure the raw materials, moringa and turmeric, to sustain the company's demand for their production of herbal supplements. Dr. Sicat, on the other hand, offered to provide the necessary equipment to be used in the processing of such herbs.

With its company's ideals, according to the CEO himself, which is to find solutions to problems plaguing the country with cancer being the most common. Bauertek Corporation is in pursuit of research, development, and production of allherbal supplements. natural Bauertek is a German word in which Bauer means farm or farmer or farming, while tek stands for technology. Combined together, it means "farm-based technology". Its laboratory is located in Sitio

Kabilang Bakood, Sta. Rita, Guguinto, Bulacan. Most of the food supplements developed and manufactured by Bauertek involve malunggay and other herbs like sambong, banaba, turmeric and duhat extracts.

The NEUST-Gabaldon Campus will serve as contract growers of moringga (malungay) on the first phase of its operation and growing turmeric will follow on the second phase. A five-hectare land resource in the Campus is allocated for the

demo-farm and nursery of moringa. It was visited and inspected by the Bauertek team last October 1st, 2020, prior to the MOA signing. Other than that, the University has committed man-power and facilities for the said project. The newly constructed Agriculture Training Center will be refurbished and retrofitted for the processing of moringa and other herbs, while the seeds as well as the planting materials and processing technology and protocols will be provided by the (Continue to Page 21)

pharmaceutical company. They also have confirmed technical assistance from planting to harvesting and processing of the needed herbs.

The University seizes the opportunity to develop production and processing technology for

moringa through rigorous research in which the said project will be instrumental. For over a decade now, it has been the top priority to establish good agricultural practices and stringent regulations to guarantee the quality and stability of moringa products. Hence, the Project Proposal-Phase 1 was already approved and green-lighted by the university research department, assured on the upshot of the project for the local farmers to be benefited from the introduction of moringa-based production and its potential market.

Depression is a worrying health condition. Many people face issues with mental health, especially in this time of pandemic According to the Department of Health of the Philippines, 3.3 million suffers from depressive disorders with suicide rates of 2.5 males and 1.7 females per 100,000. The World Health Organization also reported that 800,000 people commit suicide every year.

Nowadays, stigma is still a huge problem to every individual receiving the care and attention they need.

In the past days, weeks, and months ahead, many cases of deaths were reported due to COVID-19 around the world. The World Health Organization made an assessment that COVID-19 is a pandemic. Pandemic, if misunderstood can cause severe fear, anxieties, or uncertainties that can lead to depression or in worst case scenario, it can lead to death. In this case, we need to address this issue because when ignored, it may lead an individual to committing suicide.

In the new normal, face to face is not possible, but this is not a hindrance to give or to help a person who needs counseling or who needs somebody to listen and to talk to.

To bring attention to this, the NEUST CAS Social and Behavioral Sciences Department (SBSD), in collaboration with the Guidance and Counseling Office proposed a project



called "Tara Usap Tayo, CASama mo AKO" which was launched on May 1, 2020. It is a Facebook page offering an online psychological first aid to frontliners, students, workers, and patients affected by the COVID-19 pandemic, not only here at NEUST but nationwide. It aims at helping people who are experiencing stress, anxieties, and the like. This page has already reached many individuals who are in need of care and comfort, especially in this time of pandemic. The telemental health program has

already served clients from different places such as, Cabanatuan City, different towns of Nueva Ecija, Nueva Viscaya, Bataan, Baler, and Negros Occidental.

The program is open to all, especially those who have been experiencing depression. Everyone is welcome to avail this well-timed service. At present, to further strengthen and stabilize the program, the NEUST CAS is planning to have MOA/MOU with the different agencies and hospitals nationwide.






Webinar on Plumbing Basics


